There are two incorrect sentences on p. 263.

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In the 12th line of the section entitled “Keratinocytes Expressing  $\alpha 6B$  Assemble Hemidesmosomes and Display Normal Adhesive and Migratory Properties,” the sentence beginning “This is interesting...” and the sentence directly following it are incorrect. The statements should read:

A recent study has suggested that dephosphorylation of the  $\alpha 6A$  subunit is necessary for the association of the keratin IF with the  $\alpha 6\beta 4$  heterodimer (Baker et al., 1997). The  $\alpha 6B$  subunit has not been found to be phosphorylated, and thus phosphorylation events cannot play a role in hemidesmosome assembly supported by this variant in association with  $\beta 4$ .
